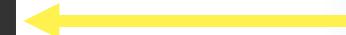
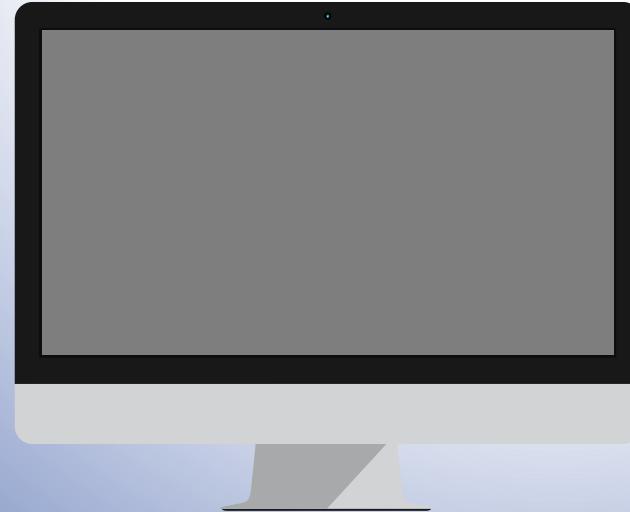

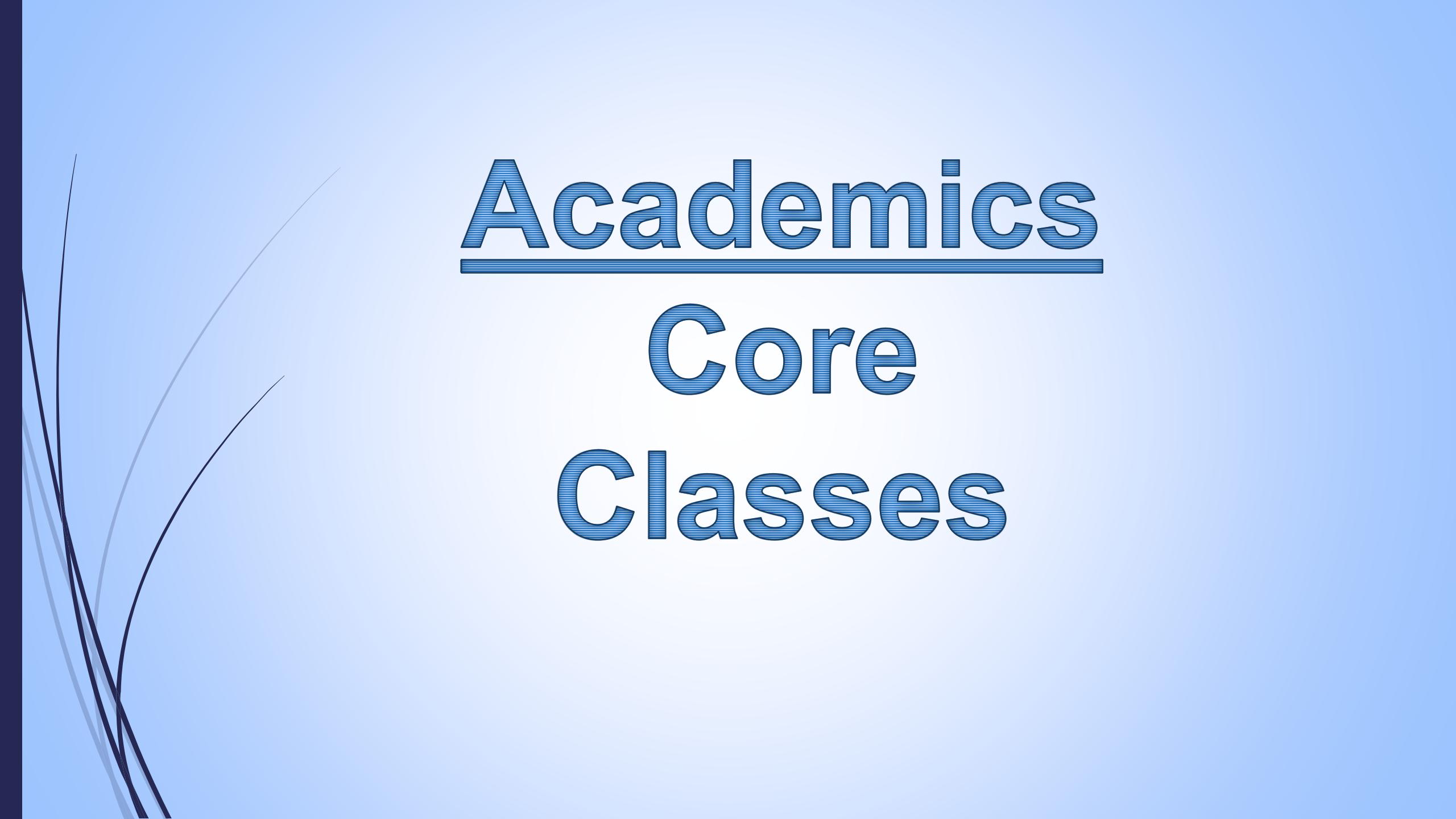

February 17- Core Course Verification/Elective Selection form sent home with your student.

February 24- Core Course Verification/Elective Selection form due signed by parent.

WEB (rising 8th only) is an application-based electives with limited class size. The application must be filled out in addition to selecting the elective as your first choice. Online applications are due by Tuesday, April 15st. Applicants who are approved to take these courses will be notified in May.

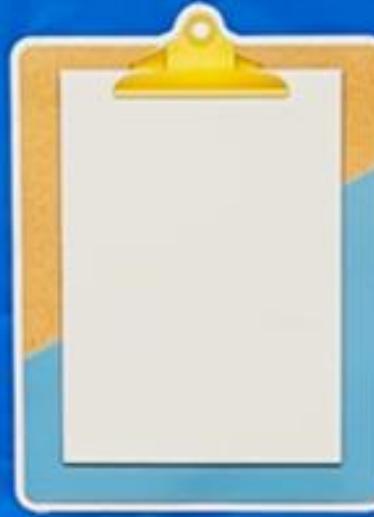

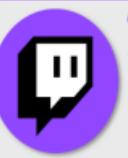
